**URGENT APPEAL - THE OBSERVATORY** 

SYR 001 / 0111 / OBS 001 Disciplinary hearing / Harassment Syria January 3, 2010

The Observatory for the Protection of Human Rights Defenders, a joint programme of the International Federation for Human Rights (FIDH) and the World Organisation Against Torture (OMCT), requests your urgent intervention in the following situation in **Syria**.

## Description of the situation:

The Observatory has been informed by reliable sources about acts of harassment against Mr. **Radif Mustafa**, lawyer and President of the Kurdish Comittee for Human Rights, by the Aleppo Bar Association.

According to information received, on December 19, 2010, Mr. Radif Mustafa was interrogated in the framework of a hearing held by the Aleppo Bar Association. The hearing took place on the basis of a disciplinary action launched by the President of the Aleppo Bar Association following a decision of the Damascus Bar Association. Grounds of referral include alleged "membership to an illegal organisation", "actions against the Syrian government" through Mr. Radif Mustafa's human rights work and his publications on human rights issues, "tackling topics with a view of undermining national unity" and "publishing unfounded news".

This disciplinary action is based on Law No. 30 on the Lawyers Profession. The next hearing is scheduled for January 30, 2011.

The Observatory firmly denounces these acts of harassment by the Bar Association, which seem to aim at further muzzling lawyers involved in human rights issues.

The Observatory recalls that paragraph 23 of the <u>Basic Principles on the Role of</u> <u>Lawyers</u> provide that lawyers "shall have the right to take part in public discussion of matters concerning the law, the administration of justice and the promotion and protection of human rights and to join or form local, national or international organizations and attend their meetings, without suffering professional restrictions".

## Actions requested:

Please write to the Syrian authorities, urging them to:

i. Guarantee in all circumstances the physical and psychological integrity of Mr. Radif Mustafa;

ii. Put an end to any acts of harassment, including at the disciplinary level, against Mr. Radif Mustafa and more generally against all human rights defenders in Syria;

iii. Conform with the provisions of the Basic Principles on the Role of Lawyers and of the UN Declaration on Human Rights Defenders, adopted by the General Assembly of the United Nations on December 9, 1998, especially its:

- Article 1, which states that "everyone has the right, individually and in association with others, to promote and to strive for the protection and realization

of human rights and fundamental freedoms at the national and international levels";

- Article 5(b), which establishes that "for the purpose of promoting and protecting human rights and fundamental freedoms, everyone has the right, individually and in association with others, at the national and international levels to form, join and participate in non-governmental organizations, associations or groups";
- Article 6(b), which stipulates that "everyone has the right, individually and in association with others, as provided for in human rights and other applicable international instruments, freely to publish, impart or disseminate to others views, information and knowledge on all human rights and fundamental freedoms";
- Article 9.3(c), which states that "everyone has the right, individually and in association with others, to offer and provide professionally qualified legal assistance or other relevant advice and assistance in defending human rights and fundamental freedoms";
- and Article 12.2, which provides that "the State shall take all necessary measures to ensure the protection by the competent authorities of everyone, individually and in association with others, against any violence, threats, retaliation, de facto or de jure adverse discrimination, pressure or any other arbitrary action as a consequence of his or her legitimate exercise of the rights referred to in the present Declaration";

iv. Ensure in all circumstances respect for human rights and fundamental freedoms in accordance with international human rights standards and international instruments ratified by the Syrian Arab Republic.
